Thank you, for the opportunity to give my personal testimony on redistricting. I live in Austin, Texas and reside in Texas Senate District 14 and Congressional District 47. I have numbered the points I want to make below:

- 1. It is critical that redistricting in done by our elected officials and not come independent panel. My elected officials represent me!
- 2. The new map should reflect one person, one vote as provided in the Constitution, and there be equal voting power in each district

by those individuals who are legally eligible to vote.

- 3. The new redistricting map must fairly represent the voting patterns of Texas. If Texas receives new Congressional seats, they should represent the Texas population's voting pattern which is Republican.
