I am a registered voter in the State of Texas, and a property owner who diligently pays my annual property taxes, the rates for which are set by the Texas Legislature. Representation of my interests in the state and Congress - financial, educational, cultural or otherwise - is important to me, as is my ability to vote in a safe and impartial manner. Unfortunately in Texas, gerrymandered districts make it easier for politicians to select their voters than the other way around.

I vote in TX-35, HD-51, and SD-21. It's a well-known fact that Representative Lloyd Doggett's Congressional seat is one of the most gerrymandered seats in the state. It is plain to see that many districts have been cracked and packed as it pleases the mapmakers.

Therefore, I call upon the members of the redistricting committee to do right by the voters of our great state and commit to establishing an independent non-partisan redistricting commission to apportion seats and districts in such a way that is fair and equitable and for once, makes sense.

The population in the metro areas, including mine, has grown by leaps and bounds this past decade.
