DARS Mission Statement

To work in partnership with Texans with disabilities and families with children who have developmental delays to improve the quality of their lives and to enable their full participation in society.



Vocational Rehabilitation (VR)

Helps Texans with disabilities prepare for, find and/or keep employment.

- State-federal partnership
 - 80% federal funds, 20% state.
- Eligibility criteria
 - Presence of a physical or mental disability that creates a substantial impediment to employment,
 - Services are required to achieve employment outcomes, and
 - Likelihood that the consumer will benefit from DARS services.
- Work-related services are individualized
 - May include counseling, vocational training, medical services, assistive devices, job placement assistance, and other services.



DARS Transition Services

Transition Services

- Part of Vocational Rehabilitation program.
 - Time-limited services
- Seamless transition from school to work.
 - Job
 - Vocational Technical training
 - College
- Connects students, families and schools to world of work.
- Prepares students with disabilities to make informed decisions about their future goals.
- Transition Vocational Rehabilitation Counselor (TVRC) deliver services on school campuses and in family homes.



DARS Transition Services

Transition Vocational Rehabilitation Counselor (TVRC)

- 130 TVRCs deployed statewide.
- Presence in roughly 362 schools statewide.
- 9573 transition students served in the first three quarters of FY2008.
- 8280 transition students served in FY2007.



DARS Transition Services

Letter of Agreement between DARS and TEA

- Encourage community and work experiences that provide the opportunity for students with disabilities to participate in skill development in community settings.
- Coordinate to the extent possible the development of a student's Individual Plan for Employment (IPE) with the student's Individual Education Plan (IEP).
- Utilize existing school assessment information to the extent possible to determine eligibility for DARS services
- Provide, purchase or arrange for services on the IPE that are needed for the student's specific employment outcome.



DARS Supported Employment

Assists consumers with the most significant disabilities to obtain and maintain integrated employment.

- Identify consumer skills, interests, abilities and support needs.
- Identify employer's unmet needs.
- Individualized help finding the most appropriate job match in the open market.
- Provide or arrange for supports to accommodate these consumers.
- Ongoing supports to maintain the job.



DARS Supported Employment

DADS/DARS Memorandum Of Understanding

- DARS: As the designated vocational rehabilitation agency, provides time-limited employment services to an individual that results in an individualized, competitive job.
- DADS: As the designated long-term services and supports agency, provides:
 - Non-employment supports for an individual receiving DARS services;
 - Short-term employment services for individuals found ineligible for DARS services; and
 - Long-term employment supports once the DARS timelimited employment services have been completed.
- Common goal: Assist consumers in obtaining and maintaining integrated, competitive employment.
