Mary Taylor Henderson has been Deputy Division Chief of the Consumer Protection & Public Health Division of the Office of the Attorney General of Texas since February 1997. From March 1999 to April 2001, Mary also served in a dual capacity as Chief of the Charitable Trusts Section. Ms. Henderson's current responsibilities include overseeing the Charitable Trusts, Insurance Practices and Public Agency Representation Sections of the Consumer Protection & Public Health Division.

Ms. Henderson has worked as an attorney with The University of Texas System Office of General Counsel, has served as an Assistant Attorney General in the General Litigation and Tort Litigation Divisions and spent several years in private litigation practice in Corpus Christi, Texas.
