- OIF/OEF Peer to Peer (Staffed with Combat Veterans re-trained and certified)
- Outreach driven and fully integrated/supported by a 24/7 statewide network
- Accessible statewide by dialing 2-1-1 or by live chat at <u>www.unitedwaysatx.org</u>
- 100% client follow up
- Funded to date with private donor contributions and matching United Way funds – program costs have been approximately \$500k per year
- Certified by the Alliance of Information and Referral Systems (AIRS) National Standards are followed

Texas Military Family Access Program/Military 2-1-1 Developed by the United Way of San Antonio Recommendations

- Centralize Military 2-1-1 with the Alamo Area Center statewide military transfers directed as other centers are unable to support specific needs
- Veteran call transfers from statewide 2-1-1 centers are occurring at present through an existing MOU relationship over 1250 such clients to date
- DHHS to designate Alamo Area as the Statewide Veterans Center and provide funding
- Retain the autonomous nature of other centers in Charge 6 (e.g. TVC, TVLB, etc.) as each is highly specialized in nature and serves a niche support role
