TONY FABELO is the Austin-based director of research of the Justice Center of the Council of State Governments. Fabelo was the executive director of the Texas Criminal Justice Policy Council from 1991-2003. Before that, he served in other capacities assisting, since 1984, five Texas governors and 14 regular biennial Texas legislatures. In recent years he has worked on correctional system reforms in Texas, Kansas, Pennsylvania, Michigan, Wisconsin, North Carolina, Ohio and Indiana as part of the Justice Reinvestment initiative of the center and leads the probation performance and the school discipline and juvenile justice projects for the center. In November 2010 he was appointed by US Attorney General Eric H. Holder, Jr. to serve as one of the members of the US Department of Justice Science Advisory Board that will provide guidance to the department's Office of Justice Programs in the development of long-range plans and scientific initiatives. In early 2012 he was appointed to a prestigious panel of the National Academy of Sciences presently reviewing the consequences of high incarceration rates to issue a national report in 2013. Fabelo holds a doctorate in government from the University of Texas at Austin.
