
Hi, I am writing to you in my capacity as a Senate District Chair for Harris County Democratic Party, specifically SD17.

While I identify with one party, I believe this process should be non-partisan, and that creating "fair maps" without discriminatory, racial, and partisan bias is a non-partisan issue. I make the following proposal in that context.

First, redraw SD17 entirely within Harris County. Second, reduce the number of Senate Districts in Harris County from 8 to 5, so that the new Senate Districts are all within the County (county-line rule). Finally, nest House Districts within Senate District (5 House districts per Senate District) so that similar neighborhoods stay together.

1. Draw SD17 to be compact, and within Harris County.

In the case of SD17, the District is split into Harris (65%), Fort Bend (23%), and Brazoria (12%) counties. People who live "inside the loop" (urban Houston) share a State Senator with residents in the suburbs, rural areas, and Freeport on the Gulf Coast!




2. Respect Harris County boundaries in drawing State Senate Districts.

As you know, Harris County is split across 8 Senate Districts, with only 3 of districts (SD6, SD7 and SD15) entirely within Harris County.

Targeting the ideal district population of 811,147, Harris County (population 4,092,459) can be divided into 5 Senate Districts (SD6, SD7, SD13, SD15, and SD17).




This follows the idea outlined in the House District "county line rule" -- a county that has sufficient population for two or more whole districts must be divided into that number of districts, with no district extending into another county.



3. Base Senate Districts in Harris County on nested House Districts that are adjacent to one another.

The current districts "carve up" Harris County awkwardly. The districts are contiguous, but not compact. Why does SD15 swoop around SD6 with SD13 sandwiched in between? Why is SD6 cramped between SD15 and SD13, then stretched east? Why are SD17 and SD13 swirled around one another like yin and yang?



I propose that Harris County's 24 House Districts be nested 5 per Senate District, into Regional areas (e.g. West, North, South-West, South-East, and East). This is just an example based on current House Districts for illustrative purposes:



I urge the committee to schedule another hearing after maps are drawn, so the redistricting process moves forward transparently and allows for further public input.
