Message:

As a Republican and a proud supporter of democratic principles, I am writing to express my strong opposition to the recent push for mid-decade redistricting efforts, particularly those occurring outside the standard post-census cycle. Let me be clear: redistricting outside the 10-year census window is both unnecessary and damaging to the legitimacy of our elections, regardless of which party benefits.

We all know what this is. Let's not pretend it's anything other than an attempt to gerrymander districts, skew representation, and tip the electoral scales. As a Republican, I find it deeply concerning that members of our own party are leading this charge. This is a betrayal of the core conservative principle of fair play and limited government manipulation.

The Facts:

- The U.S. Constitution (Article I, Section 2) mandates redistricting after the decennial census. There is no requirement or justification for additional redistricting unless compelled by court order (e.g., due to proven Voting Rights Act violations).
- The Supreme Court has repeatedly emphasized that states should not redistrict mid-decade unless required to fix unconstitutional maps. (See *League of United Latin American Citizens v. Perry*, 2006.)
- Mid-census redistricting undermines public trust, destabilizes representation, and costs taxpayers millions in legal and administrative fees.
- Voters across party lines consistently express opposition to gerrymandering. According to a 2023 Pew Research survey, 74% of Americans — including majorities of Republicans — believe redistricting should be done fairly and transparently, not manipulated for partisan gain.

If Republicans want to win elections, we must do it by winning hearts and minds, not by carving up maps to rig outcomes. Cheating is cheating, no matter who does it. Let's not become what we claim to oppose.

I urge you to stand up for the rule of law, consistency, and the voters who expect principled leadership. Put an end to mid-census redistricting schemes and preserve the integrity of our democratic institutions.
