SECTION 1. Section 64.001(a), Civil Practice and Remedies

(1) in an action by a vendor to vacate a fraudulent
purchase of property;
(2) in an action by a creditor to subject any property

- 4 SECTION 4. As soon as practicable after the effective date
- 5 of this Act, the attorney general shall adopt rules for the
- 6 implementation of Subchapter H, Chapter 5, Property Code, as added

- 8 SECTION 5. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to
- 9 the purchase of or other acquisition of title to real property on or
- 10 after the effective date of this Act. The purchase of or other
- 11 acquisition of title to real property before the effective date of
- 12 this Act is governed by the law in effect immediately before the
- 13 effective date of this Act, and that law is continued in effect for
- 14 that purpose.
- 15 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
